A New Season, A New Song

As We Turn the Calendar...to January, the church does something a little countercultural: instead of rushing ahead, we linger.

While the World Resets...with resolutions and fresh starts, the church continues to sing the Christmas story just a bit longer. We stay with the mystery of the Word made flesh, with angels and shepherds, with light shining in the darkness. Even as the decorations come down and daily routines resume, the message remains: God is still here, dwelling among us. On January 4th, we will observe Epiphany and continue lingering in the Christmas season with the magi's arrival.

January worship... carries us through the Sundays after Epiphany, a season of revelation. In word, song, and sacrament, we hear again and again how Christ is revealed not only to kings and crowds, but to ordinary people in ordinary places. The music of Epiphany often feels quieter and more searching than Christmas carols, inviting us to listen closely for God's presence in our own lives.

In the Weeks Ahead... you'll hear hymns that speak of light, calling, and journey, hymn texts that reminds us our faith is not static, but something we live and grow into. Whether sung boldly or prayerfully, these songs help shape us as people who follow Christ beyond the manger and into the world God so loves.

It is a Joy...to be part of this singing, praying, and worshipping community. Thank you for the ways you bring your voices and hearts into worship each week. In this season of Epiphany, may the music we share help us notice God's light in unexpected places and recognize Christ at work in our daily lives. As we move into a new year, may our worship guide us, sustain us, and send us out in hope.

All Shall be Amen and Alleluia!

A Message from Council President, Cara Papenheim

Has All that Holiday Hosting Left You Completely Exhausted as We Head into the New Year?

- Did you set an exquisite holiday table with the good dishes, vintage silverware, and special Christmas napkins?
- Or were you the perfect party guest—making sure you didn't over- or under-dress, sourcing the perfect bottle of wine or fancy holiday dish towel as a hostess gift, and offering to do the dishes and help clean up after each lovely event?

Hosting is a special burden—one that must be taken on with care, humility, and love. Guesting, while it may look easy from the outside, carries its own challenges. Nobody wants an Aunt Patti, the guest who simply cannot be pleased, or that friend Rachel—overly opinionated and determined to derail every conversation until her views are accepted as the only option.

In almost every social gathering, the only thing people at the table have in common is the host.

Finding a uniting topic of conversation—or creating the right meal—can be a challenge for both host and guest alike.

Admittedly... I didn't attend many Advent services this year. But when it came time for communion on the Third Sunday of Advent—the Sunday of Joy—and the Eucharistic Prayer began, I was shaken... and I was joyful.

I've had the ***Eucharistic Prayer*** memorized since I was seven, but this Advent season delivered the message in a modern and powerful way:



**Jesus was always
the guest—yet
here, at this table,
He is the host.**

Our modern Eucharistic Prayer... names Jesus as both guest and host, uniting the congregation in a single mission:

“Do this to remember me.”

As the season of Epiphany begins and a brand-new year of hosting and guesting lies ahead, consider the impact we can make on Jesus' behalf:

- Almost half of our Council is new to their roles, and our goal as church leadership is to help them feel welcome and included right away.
- Lunch for the Soul remains a pillar of community, hosting churches and neighbors who look forward to a warm meal and weekly fellowship.
- We continue seeking opportunities to host religious and community-focused groups in our building, offering affordable rental options and a safe place to gather.
- We prepare our home for a new Pastor by supporting the physical space of the church through property work days and faithful financial contributions.

As individuals, we can also extend the invitation—bringing friends and neighbors to Outreach and Evangelism events such as:

During the week...Jesus may be just another guest in our lives. But on Sunday mornings, we all attend the same party—with one thing in common: the Host, the Redeemer of Life.


