What to Expect in Worship

Worship services can be intimidating for newcomers. While we try to make worship as accessible as possible for everyone, we know that some aspects can be confusing. Feel free to ask an usher or someone near you for help if you have any questions today. We are happy to help and want all voices to be included in praise to God.

Our worship style is traditional at Holy Cross. A full liturgy is used to focus our praise and prayers to God. Notes are included in the side gutter of the bulletin to explain why we use the various liturgical elements. Communion is celebrated every Sunday at Holy Cross. The table (altar) is not our table, but Christ's table. Just as Christ welcomes all, all are welcome to receive communion at Holy Cross. Pastor will give instructions on how we celebrate communion at that part of the service. Written instructions are also included at that point in the bulletin.

Throughout the year we emphasize each liturgical season differently to mark the passage of time. Liturgical texts change to reflect aspects of that season, some elements are removed or added to reflect the mood of that season, and colors used to decorate the chancel are changed to provide visual reminders of the current season.

This morning we are using Dr. Wilda Gafney's Women's Lectionary (Year W). Dr. Gafney's translation and selections of scripture for the Women's Lectionary centers women and other often-overlooked people in biblical texts. She uses careful scholarship to highlight where the original languages include women, feminine imagery for God, or the experiences of marginalized communities. Her choices bring forward voices that traditional translations sometimes obscure, helping us experience familiar passages in new ways that honor the fullness of God's people.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

Theo Renner Page

Parents – Daniel Renner and Sabina Page
Sponsor – Stefanie Franziska Page

PRESENTATION

Candidates for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather with the ministers at the font.

Pastor: In baptism our gracious heavenly Father frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the church, the body of Christ. Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

Who presents this child for baptism?

Sponsor: *I present Theo Renner Page for baptism.*

Pastor: Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Theo Renner Page baptized into Christ?

Parents: *We do.*

Pastor: As you bring Theo to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

To live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help Theo grow in the Christian faith and life?

Parents: *We do.*

Pastor: Sponsor, do you promise to nurture Theo in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsor: I do.

Pastor: People of God, do you promise to support Theo and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

Assembly: We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the parents and sponsors.

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Parents/Sponsor: We renounce them.

Pastor: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Parents/Sponsor: We renounce them.

Pastor: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Parents/Sponsor: We renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Father?

**Assembly: I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**Assembly: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our
Lord,**

**who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.**

**On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge the living and the
dead.**

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
Assembly: **I believe in the Holy Spirit,
 the holy catholic church,
 the communion of saints,
 the forgiveness of sins,
 the resurrection of the body,
 and the life everlasting.**

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

Pastor: The Lord be with you.
Assembly: **And also with you.**

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
Assembly: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Assisting Minister pours water into the font.

Pastor: Blessed are you, O God, maker and ruler of all things. Your voice thundered over the waters at creation. You water the mountains and send springs into the valleys to refresh and satisfy all living things.

Through the waters of the flood you carried those in the ark to safety. Through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery to freedom. In the wilderness you nourished them with water from the rock, and you brought them across the river Jordan to the promised land.

By the baptism of his death and resurrection, your Son Jesus has carried us to safety and freedom. The floods shall not overwhelm us, and the deep shall not swallow us up, for Christ has brought us over to the land of promise. He sends us to make disciples, baptizing in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Pour out your Holy Spirit; wash away sin in this cleansing water; clothe the baptized with Christ; and claim your daughters and sons, no longer slave and free, no longer male and female, but one with all the baptized in Christ Jesus, who lives and

reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

BAPTISM

Pastor: Theo Renner Page, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Assembly: **Amen.**

Pastor: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your children new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays:

Pastor: Sustain Theo Renner Page with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

Assembly: **Amen.**

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized.

Pastor: Theo Renner Page, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

Assembly: **Amen.**

WELCOME

A lighted candle may be given to the newly baptized.

Assisting Minister: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Assisting Minister: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Assembly: **We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share. Join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.**

The sharing of THE PEACE is an ancient ritual that puts us right with our neighbors before we offer our gifts to God.

On the night in which he was betrayed, and as they were sitting at a meal, Jesus gave thanks, took a piece of bread and broke it. He gave it to the disciples saying, "This is my body. It is broken for you. Do this to remember me.

Later, after they had eaten, he took a cup of wine, gave thanks and said, "This cup is the new relationship with God made possible because of my death. Drink this all of you, to remember me."

So now we do as Jesus did. We take this bread and wine, the produce of the earth and fruit of human labor. In these, Jesus has promised to be present; through these, Christ can make us whole.

We ask, merciful God, that you send, in kindness, your Holy Spirit to settle on this bread and wine and fill them with the fullness of Jesus. Let that same Spirit rest on us, call us from the folly of this world, until in wisdom, we conform to the shape of him whose food we now share.

All this we ask through your son, Jesus Christ.

By him, with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever.

Martyrs

Sunday, December 28, 2025

This day commemorates the young children killed by Herod in Bethlehem in his jealous attempt to murder the baby Jesus, a sobering reminder of the evil that led Christ to be born for our salvation.

Name of Jesus

Thursday, January 1, 2026

By Jewish law, every baby boy was circumcised and named on the eighth day of life, so on the eighth day of Christmas the church celebrates this event in Jesus' life. The keeping of the covenant as well as Jesus' name are signs of God's salvation given to us through him.

Johann Konrad Wilhelm Loehe, renewer of the church, died 1872

Friday, January 2, 2026

Loehe was a pastor in nineteenth-century Germany. Loehe's chief concern was that a congregation find its life in the holy communion, and from that source evangelism and social ministries would flow. He sent pastors to North America, Australia, New Guinea, Brazil, and Ukraine.
